A comprehensive, farmer focused sustainability program

Triple S™ is a farmer focused sustainability program, raising the standard of agricultural practices year on year

Triple S™ (Sustainably Sourced & Supplied) is Cargill's own sustainability certification program.

Farmers who commit to this program pledge to produce their soy following criteria in five key areas:

1. Sustainable land use, with a baseline date for land use change of January 2008;
2. Good agricultural practice;
3. Community relations and human rights;
4. Engagement in a process of continuous improvement;
5. Measuring greenhouse gas emissions.

The program is independently verified and is benchmarked against the FEAC (European feed compounder association) sustainable soy guidelines.

Triple S™ soy volumes are traced through a single-site mass balance chain of custody, from farm to customer. Traceability is checked by an independent third-party auditor.

Our farmer suppliers commit to a program of continuous improvement as a condition of Triple S™ Certification. Improved agricultural practice process is supported by independent agronomists who develop the action plan with the farmers and revisit at 6 month intervals to check on progress.

Participating farms comply with all national and state regulations on working conditions and workers' rights. Farms meet the requirements of health and safety, ensuring that workers are properly trained, and have access to suitable safety equipment.
