



Commitment to the Responsible Sourcing of Plant and Marine Ingredients

Introduction While the aquaculture industry consumes a relatively small proportion of the global agricultural output, aquaculture feed is primarily composed of agricultural and marine ingredients or derivatives of these.

Cargill's purpose is to nourish the world in a safe, responsible, and sustainable way. We believe forests and farming must coexist, as both are crucial to life on the planet. Forests provide food, water, fuel, medicine, and livelihoods to billions of people, while also providing vital habitat, regulating the climate, and storing carbon for the wider environment. Agriculture is essential to the livelihoods of billions of people and to food security for all. Cargill sits in a unique position between growers and consumers.

Commitment Change starts at the individual business level, across the supply chains to that business. As Cargill's aqua nutrition business in Indonesia, we are committed to transitioning toward deforestation- and conversion-free supply chains for the aqua feeds we make for our aqua feed customers, and to follow that commitment with a public action plan. Cargill's aqua nutrition business in Indonesia made this commitment in line with the ASC Feed Standard related to the cut-off date.

We also commit to publishing a plan for this transition by the end of 2025 and to publish an annual report on progress against the plan, which will focus on ingredients derived from soy and palm oil as the main crops at risk, as well as other high-volume plant ingredients.
